Disability Services

At Holdsworth we believe that living with disabilities can mean living with possibilities.

Our team provides a variety of recreation and respite programs for people with intellectual disabilities and their carers. Through active peer support, community integration and hands-on skill, our team encourages self-awareness, skill development, independence and the building of friendships, social networks and participation.

Adult Disability Services

The adult program is for anyone who has a mild to moderate intellectual disability, 18 to 65 and lives with their primary carer in the Woollahra, Waverley, Randwick, Botany and Sydney City Local Government Areas.

We offer a range of group activities that allow people to participate in recreational activities and make new friends.

These include

- Adventure Club
- Saturday Gang

Specialised program activities include:

- Bowling
- Gym
- Art classes and end of year exhibition
- Funky Sundays Dance Club

Children's Disability Services

This program is for anyone who is under 18 with a mild to moderate intellectual disability who lives with their primary carer in the Woollahra, Waverley, Randwick, Botany and Sydney City Local Government Areas.

We provide:

- Information and referral
- Recreational & social support programs
- School holiday activities
- Funsworth afternoon program
- PlaygroupPlus

Other Services

Using money received from grants and fundraising we are able to offer a variety of other one-off activities such as sexual health workshops and camps.

How to become part of Holdsworth

The program coordinator will arrange a meeting with you to discuss the services, your child's needs and yours as a carer prior to commencing with the service. Priority will be given to those who have no or little access to other services.

The Centre also provides programs for young children and community transport services (see separate brochures).

Holdsworth welcomes diversity and does not discriminate against anyone on any grounds. For many of our services we ask for a contribution towards our costs; however, services will never be refused because of an inability to pay.

If you are not eligible for a service offered by Holdsworth, or need services that we do not provide, we can assist in referral to other services in Eastern Sydney.
